Dear Mr. Wilson: As the author of Assembly Bill No. 402, I am requesting the inclusion into the Assembly Daily Journal my statement to clarify the intent of the bill as it relates to Apple Valley Ranchos Water Company and the Town of Apple Valley.

AB 402 would add 56133.5 of the Government Code by creating a pilot program in Napa and San Bernardino Counties that would allow the respective Local Agency Formation Commissions (LAFCo) to authorize a city or district to provide new or extended services outside its boundary and its spheres of influence to support existing or planned uses involving public or private properties, subject to a noticed public hearing and a number of determinations made by the LAFCo.

With respect to water corporations subject to the regulatory jurisdiction of the California Public Utilities Commission, AB 402 contains the following provision in 56133.5 (e): The pilot program

established pursuant to this section shall be consistent with Chapter 8.5 (commencing with Section 1501) of the Public Utilities Code. By including this provision in AB 402, my intent is to clarify that existing provisions of law related to duplication of service provisions and to just compensation shall apply for private utilities.

AB 437, beginning January 1, 2017, establishes the Program to provide qualified small businesses grants equal to either 10 percent or 15 percent of any excess credit amount attributable to the small business, as specified.

Among its provisions, AB 437 adds Section 70002 to the Revenue and Taxation Code. This proposed section requires the State Controller, upon receipt of a certificate issued to a qualified small business, partner, or "S" corporation shareholder, to pay the qualified small business the grant amount indicated upon the certificate. It is my intent that this certificate be presented to the State Controller in the form of a claim schedule, as is standard business practice.

Legislative Intent—Assembly Bill No. 438

Dear Mr. Wilson: Assembly Bill 438 reflects my discussions with the Department of Industrial Relations to move forward California's efforts to ensure that all of our state's services are accessible to our diverse populations. This bill requires the Division of Workers' Compensation within the Department of Industrial Relations to translate specified forms and fact sheets into Chinese, Korean, Tagalog, and Vietnamese.

It is not the intent of Legislature, with the enactment of AB 438, to also require a similar change in any forms and benefits notices that are generated as a result of the normal processing of a workers' compensation claim by the claims administrator, employer, or insurer.

Unfortunately, the lack of language access creates obstacles to obtaining the workers' compensation benefits for which injured workers are legally entitled to when they are Limited-English Proficient (LEP). California is home to the largest LEP population with nearly seven million LEP residents in 2010, comprising nearly 20 percent of the state's population.

AB 438 would help close the language access gap that Californians who are limited-English proficient face when seeking workers' compensation claims. California's diverse population will benefit from being able to access critical state services, regardless of language proficiency.

Legislative Intent—Assembly Bill No. 525

Dear Mr. Wilson: I am writing to explain some of Assembly Bill 525's most discussed provisions to ensure that the intent of the Legislature is clear.

Business and Professions Code §20020: The Meaning of Substantial Compliance

Assembly Bill 525 enables a franchisor to terminate a franchisee upon the franchisee's failure to "substantially comply with the lawful requirements imposed upon the franchisee by the franchisor." This provision is based on termination provisions in six other states, including New Jersey and Wisconsin.

The "substantial compliance" standard is modeled on the traditional contract law principle of "substantial performance." As discussed in the analyses of both the Senate and Assembly Judiciary Committees, dated April 21, 2015 and July 15, 2015 respectively, the substantial compliance language as applied in California is intended to follow the New Jersey court's interpretation of "substantial compliance" that means "surely something less than absolute adherence to every nuanced term of an agreement, but substantial compliance, at a minimum, requires that the franchisee refrain from acting in direct defiance" of the purpose of the contract (GMC v New A.C. Chevrolet, Inc., 91 F Supp 2d 733, 740 (2000).) California jury instructions provide further guidance on the meaning of this term. California courts have long held that substantial performance is achieved when a franchisee can show they "made a good faith effort to comply with the contract" and secondly, "that [the non-breaching franchisor] received essentially what the contract called for because . . . failures, if any, were so trivial that they could have been easily fixed or paid for" (CACI No. 312).

The August 24, 2015 change from compliance with the "franchise agreement" to "lawful requirements imposed upon the franchisee by the franchise agreement" better aligns this bill with the language in six other states' laws, though the intended definition of substantial compliance and meaning of the section has not changed.

Business and Professions Code §20022: Criteria for Reimbursing Franchisee Costs

Underlying Assembly Bill 525 is the idea that owning a franchise requires significant investment and risk on the part of the franchisee—risk often not shared between franchisee and franchisor.

Section 20022 is based, in large part, on franchise law from Washington and Connecticut, which require the franchisor to reimburse the franchisee, upon termination or non-renewal, for inventory, supplies and certain other items purchased by the franchisee under the terms of the franchise (RCW 19.100.180 (i)–(j), Conn. Gen. Stat. Sec. 42.133f(c)). Section 20022 is intended to ensure that terminated franchisees recoup a portion of their investment in items specific to the franchise that the franchisor can use or sell to another franchisee. To protect franchisees that are forced to pay large fees for franchise assets that remain owned by the franchisor, Assembly Bill 525 includes the phrase "or paid for" to ensure that all franchisees can seek reimbursement for franchise assets upon non-renewal or termination.

Business and Professions Code §20028: The Process and Standards for Evaluating Franchise Transfers

The intent of Section 20028 is to provide a clear and transparent process for the transfer of a franchise and to prohibit franchisors from arbitrarily withholding consent to a sale when a qualified buyer is presented. Despite an amendment removing the requirement that franchisors' standards for approving transfers be "reasonable," Assembly Bill 525 retains the requirement that any denial be based on existing criteria "as consistently applied to similarly situated franchisees" within the brand. This language preserves the intent of Assembly Bill 525: to ensure that any denial of a franchise transfer is viewed in light of the franchisor's transfer policy and its application of that policy to similarly situated franchisees; and that the franchisor does not arbitrarily apply that policy to single out a particular franchisee. The "similarly situated franchisee" standard requires franchisors to treat a franchisee's proposed transfer similarly to those proposed by its other franchisees with comparable business volume, size and locations.

Business and Professions Code §20035: Protecting the Business of a Wrongfully Terminated Franchisee

Finally, it is important to reiterate that the provision of AB 525 relating to reinstatement of a franchise to a franchise is a remedy that is not reflected in the final version of AB 525. However, the bill clearly describes, and it is the legislative intent, that a franchise has the legal right to obtain injunctive relief to prevent the selling or takeover of his business by a franchisor during any legal action.

Dear Mr. Wilson: The Legislature passed my Assembly Bill 530 unanimously, reflecting broad bi-partisan support for "revitalization" of the Los Angeles River. Achieving that revitalization will require engagement of federal, state and local agencies, to address a wide range of issues now confronting the Los Angeles River.

AB 530 intentionally has expansive language, in order to encompass that wide range of issues, including stormwater and water quality. The bill requires a "revitalization plan that addresses the unique and diverse needs of the Lower Los Angeles River and the communities through which it passes." Developing this plan cannot ignore water quality needs, as stormwater and water quality have played a central role in recent debates about the Los Angeles River. The planning effort required by AB 530 would therefore be deficient if it failed to address water quality in the Los Angeles River.

If Governor Brown signs AB 530, the Secretary of the Natural Resources Agency will appoint, in consultation with the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors, a local working group to lead this effort. It is my intent as author of AB 530 that the secretary's appointments would include members with expertise in water quality and stormwater, given the centrality of those issues to revitalizing the Los Angeles River.

Dear Mr. Wilson: I write to clarify legislative intent on Assembly Bill 848, legislation that protects the physical and mental health of people seeking alcohol and drug rehabilitation services in residential treatment facilities. Under AB 848, physicians and other appropriate medical personnel can be available on-site to provide limited, appropriate medical services if the facility chooses to make this treatment available.

The measure proposes to add Health and Safety Code Section 11834.025, which would require, as a condition of providing incidental medical services in residential treatment facilities, that a licensee obtain a certification that a health care practitioner provides to treatment program participants. The certification form, which would be developed by the Department of Health Care Services, would include a description of the alcoholism and drug abuse recovery or treatment services that a program participant needs; it would be designed for use by a health care practitioner who would use it to certify that a program participant can

receive incidental medical services at a licensed facility. The purpose of this letter to the Journal is to clarify that the licensed residential treatment facility needs to obtain the certificate, not the program participant.

Thank you for providing this opportunity to clarify the legislative intent of this bill.

Legislative Intent—Assembly Bill No. 901

Dear Mr. Wilson: As the author of Assembly Bill 901, I request inclusion of this statement into the Assembly Daily Journal to provide clarity as to the intent and interpretation of the bill as it relates to the existing local ordinances and the disclosure of certain information that facility operators are required by law to share with the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) and local jurisdictions.

As a former president of the California State Association of Counties, I am aware of many local jurisdictions that, through their authority to adopt local ordinances regulating the handling of solid waste (California Constitution Article XI, Section 7) have adopted reporting requirements that exceed the requirements of existing law and this legislation. A plain reading of my legislation makes clear that nothing in AB 901 preempts or abrogates existing local ordinances on reporting requirements related to solid waste, nor is it intended to limit their authority to adopt more stringent reporting requirements that they have the right to do under their constitutional authority.

Additionally, this bill is intended to improve CalRecycle's disposal and recycling reporting requirements by providing CalRecycle and local jurisdictions the ability to inspect trade secret business information held by private operators. This inspection authority is critical to verifying the information provided to CalRecycle and local jurisdictions. However, the sensitive information subject to inspection will undeniably contain proprietary business terms that are protected trade secrets. To provide resounding clarity that trade secret protections still apply to proprietary business data, I added language to my legislation exempting the records subject to inspection from disclosure under the California Public Records Act.

In practice, the subject records are already exempt from disclosure as they are proprietary documents held by private operators. My intent with the California Public Records Act exemptions in this bill is to clarify that proprietary data accessed by CalRecycle or a local jurisdiction remains exempt from disclosure per the Civil Code and Evidence Code protections for trade secret information. This exemption is narrowly crafted, and a plain reading of my legislation makes it clear that this exemption only applies to proprietary records subject to inspection.

The exemption does not apply to reports submitted to the CalRecycle pursuant to Public Resources Code 41821.5 (a) and 41821.5 (b). The submission of reports by operators, and the inspection of records to verify those reports are unmistakably distinct activities. The information contained in the reports are clearly a matter of public record, do not contain trade secret information, and are separate from the records held by facility operators that are subject to inspection by CalRecycle and local jurisdictions.

I submit this letter to clarify and reiterate my intent that AB 901 shall not be construed to limit the existing authority of local jurisdictions and their local ordinances, or exempt information from the California Public Records Act that is not already exempt from disclosure.

- b. He or she is likely to interact with the public while performing his or her duties.

In discussions with concerned parties, we agreed to amend AB 1042 and delete Section 7574.01 (a) (8) (D) and (E). Inadvertently, those amendments were not included in the September 4, 2015, amendments and we missed the deadline to amend bills on the Floor.

Therefore, I pledge to work with these concerned parties to ensure these amendments are enacted in 2016, before the provisions of AB 1042 become effective on January 1, 2017.
