An Act to furnish grant, convey and relinquish to the United States of America the right of way now obtained, or hereafter obtained, by the Commissioner of Public Works under an Act of the Legislature, approved March 25, 1903, entitled "An Act authorizing the Commissioner of Public Works to obtain a right of way for a canal to divert the waters of Mormon Channel into the Calaveras River, to maintain condemnation suits therefor, and making an appropriation to pay for said right of way and the costs and expenses of obtaining the same," and under other laws of the State of California, for the purpose of the construction and completion in San Joaquin County by the United States of America on and within such right of way, of a diverting canal from the Mormon Channel to the Calaveras River east of the City of Stockton and along the channel of the Calaveras River to the San Joaquin River, and to authorize the Commissioner of Public Works and the Governor of the State to execute conveyances in accord therewith.

Curry, Secretary of State, San Francisco No. 4422.
