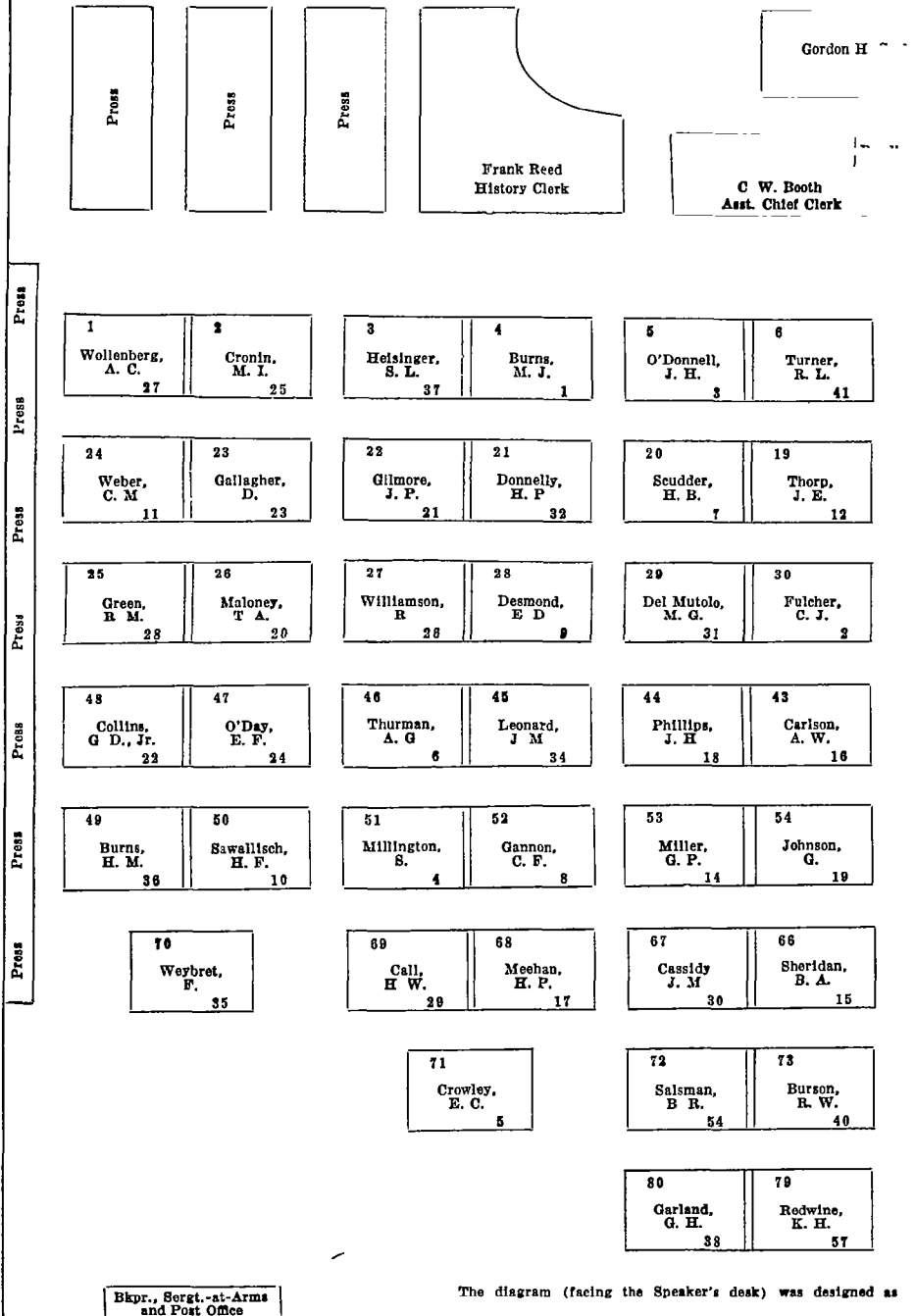

ASSEMBLY FINAL HISTORY

FIFTY-THIRD (Second Extraordinary) SESSION
