



The Legislative Budget Committee ascertains facts and makes recommendations to the Legislature and to the houses thereof concerning, the state budget, the revenues and expenditures of the State and of the organization and function of this State, its departments subdivisions and agencies with a view of reducing the cost of State Government and securing greater efficiency and economy.

In 1943, the committee was made repository for all documents and materials of all committees, except standing committees, when the work of such committees is concluded.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL OF CALIFORNIA

It is the duty of the Legislative Counsel to assist the Members of the Legislature, upon request, in the drafting and amendment of bills and resolutions; to prepare or assist in the preparation or amendment of legislative bills at the suggestion of the Governor or of any judge of a court of record or of any committee of the Legislature; upon request, to advise any state officer as to the preparation of bills to be submitted to the Legislature; and to cooperate with any legislative committee appointed to carry on investigations between sessions of the Legislature.

The Administrative-Legislative Reference Service coordinates requests from legislators involving materials and research in various sections of the Library, prepares a regular monthly bibliography on issues of legislative interest and special reading lists on request.
