Members of the Assembly: As required by Chapter 965, Statutes of 1994, the Bureau of State Audits presents its audit report assessing whether the fees the Department of Insurance (department) levies under Section 12979 and Section 736 of the Insurance Code are based on the actual costs of enforcing Proposition 103 and conducting examinations of insurance companies. This report concludes that the department appropriately modified its cost accounting system to capture costs for each of its regulatory activities. Further, the department generally based its fees for Proposition 103 on actual costs.

However, it incorrectly calculated the fees for conducting examinations of insurance companies. As a result, the department's projected billings of approximately \$13.1 million for fiscal year 1995–96 will be understated by approximately \$1.6 million. In our opinion, the department should revise the fees it will charge during fiscal year 1995–96. Also, the department's system for gathering its costs contained errors. These errors were the result of employees not correctly recording their time to the proper cost center. Since the department allocates indirect costs based on employee labor charges,

the errors that we found in the department's cost data cause a misstatement of the allocation of indirect costs. The department has begun taking corrective action to minimize future time reporting errors.
