ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 161—Napolitano. An act to amend Section 22430 of the Business and Professions Code, and to add Sections 10125.6 and 10206 to the Health and Safety Code, relating to vital statistics.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 162—Willard Murray. An act to add and repeal Section 11006.3 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, relating to public assistance.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 163—Conroy. An act to amend Sections 67, 69, and 72 of the Military and Veterans Code, relating to veterans.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 164—Knight. An act to amend Sections 48260.5, 48262, and 48264.5 of the Education Code, and to amend Section 13202.7 of the Vehicle Code, relating to vehicles.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 165—Richter. An act to add Article 7.5 (commencing with Section 65410.01) to Chapter 3 of Division 1 of Title 7 of the Government Code, relating to general plans.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 166—Cannella. An act to amend Section 22009.03 of the Government Code, relating to public employees, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.
