Is it the custom and precedent of the House to allow questions of the author before the author has closed debate?

Reply by Speaker pro Tempore

The Speaker pro Tempore replied that there is custom and precedent of the House whereby authors have yielded to questions of Members on the author's time for debate.

Parliamentary Inquiry

Assembly Member Rogan arose to the following parliamentary inquiry:

Is it opposite the Rules of the House for a Member to yield time to another Member?

Reply by Speaker pro Tempore

The Speaker pro Tempore replied that pursuant to the rules no Member shall yield to any other Member the time for which he or she is entitled to speak on any matter, in the absence of unanimous consent or $\frac{2}{3}$ of the Members present and voting.

Unanimous Consent Withheld

Assembly Member Rogan announced that he would withhold unanimous consent on any requests by Members to ask questions of authors, after the author has closed debate.

Parliamentary Inquiry

Assembly Member Isenberg arose to the following parliamentary inquiry:

Did the Speaker pro Tempore not earlier advise that the rules and custom and precedent permit Members to ask questions of authors after the author has closed debate and was it not advised that the practice could be changed with an amendment to the Rules by the House?

Reply by Speaker pro Tempore

The Speaker pro Tempore replied that in the absence of any objection questions may be asked of the author after the author has closed debate, provided the author has remaining time for debate.

Parliamentary Inquiry

Assembly Member Isenberg arose to the following parliamentary inquiry:

After an author has closed debate, is there any opportunity for a Member to ask a question of the author on matters not previously raised during debate?

Reply by Speaker pro Tempore

The Speaker pro Tempore replied that the Rules clearly state that no Member may yield time to another Member, and if objection is raised it would require $\frac{2}{3}$ present and voting to suspend Rule 108.

Parliamentary Inquiry

Assembly Member Isenberg arose to the following parliamentary inquiry:

If a Member requests to ask a question of an author, does the author no longer have the right to refuse to answer a question?

Reply by Speaker pro Tempore

The Speaker pro Tempore replied that Assembly Member Rogan's objection relates to requests to ask questions of the author, after the author has closed debate; and that although the courtesy is normally extended, in the absence of unanimous consent it would require $\frac{2}{3}$ of the Members present and voting to suspend Rule 108.

Parliamentary Inquiry

Assembly Member Bustamante arose to the following parliamentary inquiry:

Did the Speaker pro Tempore not indicate that an author may answer questions of Members while there is remaining time for debate, and is not a withholding of unanimous consent in order only after all time has expired?

Reply by Speaker pro Tempore

The Speaker pro Tempore replied that unanimous consent of the House is required for a Member to yield time to another Member, and that if objection is raised a vote of $\frac{2}{3}$ of the Members present and voting is required to suspend the rules.

The question being on the passage of the bill.
