Dear Mr. Wilson: This letter is to clarify the intent of my AB 472 of last session (Chapter 1177 of 1994).

The measure requires a person licensed to clean septic systems to file a statement with the local health officer regarding potential discharge hazards. The local health officer is then required to pass along this information to the regional water quality control board.

AB 472 was intended to provide all levels of government with greater information to evaluate waste discharges from septic systems. By requiring increased reporting responsibilities starting with the licensed inspector, the bill was designed to bring attention to faulty systems at an early stage, to ensure enhanced water quality.

Thank you for the opportunity to clarify the intent of my AB 472 of the 1993–94 legislative session.
