Dear Speaker Pringle: This letter is to clarify legislative intent relative to provisions of Senate Bill 848 (Kopp) pertaining to maximum speed limits on conventional highways.

SB 848 would provide local agencies and the Department of Transportation additional time to conduct engineering and traffic surveys on two-lane undivided highways and multilane highways other than freeways to determine whether a 65 miles-per-hour maximum speed limit is reasonable and safe for such highways.

Nothing in SB 848 removes or diminishes, nor is intended to remove or diminish, the control and responsibility over state highways by the Department of Transportation. The bill provides, and is intended to provide, that cities, counties and the department shall continue to exercise control over highways under their respective jurisdictions, especially with regard to establishing maximum speed limits on such highways.
