Members of the Assembly: As requested by the Joint Legislative Audit Committee, the Bureau of State Audits presents its audit report concerning the University of California's (UC) administration of the Tobacco-Related Disease Research Program and the Breast Cancer Research Program. This report concludes that UC could not demonstrate that it allocates grant awards equitably because, consistent with National Institutes of Health practices, UC does not retain documents produced as a part of the grant award process for the programs. In addition, except for finding that UC indeed shredded documents and that a potential conflict of interest for a Breast Cancer Research Council member did exist but is mitigated, we were unable to substantiate other allegations. Finally, UC needs to improve its administrative oversight of the programs.
