Members of the Assembly: As requested by the Joint Legislative Audit Committee and through language in the Supplemental Report of the 1995–96 Budget Act, the Bureau of State Audits presents its audit report concerning the Trade and Commerce Agency (agency). Our review focused on whether the agency's planning efforts, management systems, and organizational structure for carrying out its mission were effective and efficient. This report concludes that more can be done by the agency to measure the return on the State's investment and to oversee its activities. Specifically, the agency needs to better measure the benefits of its programs. In addition, the agency needs to improve its administrative and operational controls in certain areas. The agency also could take advantage of streamlining opportunities available to it. Finally, the agency did not always meet its statutory reporting requirements.
