Members of the Assembly: The Bureau of State Audits presents its audit report of the State Treasurer's Office Statement of Securities Accountability as of June 30, 1995.

The Statement of Securities Accountability presents the securities owned by or pledged to the State directly or under investment agreements and securities held for safekeeping. The State Treasurer's Office is responsible for the safekeeping of all securities held in the treasury or other depositories, except for securities owned by or pledged to the University of California, or for securities in other depositories owned by or pledged to the Public Employees' Retirement System, the State Teachers' Retirement System, the Legislators' Retirement System, or Judges' Retirement System. For the Statement of Securities Accountability, the State Treasurer's Office assigns dollar amounts to each security for ease of accountability rather than for purposes of valuing securities to cost or market. The dollar amounts assigned represent the par or face value, the original face value, the original principal value, the current outstanding principal balance, or a nominal value of \$1 per certificate or note. Therefore, the dollar amounts presented in the Statement of Securities Accountability should not be used to determine the value of investments of, or pledged to the State. We found that the statement presents fairly the securities accountability of the State Treasurer's Office as of June 30, 1995.

We conducted this audit to comply with the California Government Code, Section 13299.1.
