Members of the Assembly: As required by the California Government Code, Section 8546.4, the Bureau of State Audits presents the financial report of the State of California for the year ended June 30, 1994. This financial report includes a financial section with the State's general purpose financial statements presented on a basis in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP) and a statistical section with important labor, income, and population statistics.

The financial statements show that the State's General Fund generated approximately \$1.1 billion more in revenues than it spent for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1994. However, the General Fund ended the fiscal year with a fund deficit of \$1.1 billion. The GAAP basis statements include all liabilities owed by the State while the

budgetary basis statements that are used to report on the State's budget do not reflect all liabilities.
