Dotson—On April 23, 1996, AB 2984 (Margett) relating to a ban on late-term abortions, was re-referred (on a vote *solely* procedural) by the Committee on Public Safety to the Committee on Appropriations, by a vote of 13–0.

Since the criminal sanctions had been deleted from the bill, the Public Safety Committee no longer had jurisdiction over the bill. The vote was a technical necessity to remove the bill from the jurisdiction of the committee.

We voted for this procedural motion at the explicit personal request of Planned Parenthood advocate Kathy Kneier. We never have nor do we in any way support this bill.
