Dear Assembly Members: It is my pleasure to submit to you and the Legislature Reorganization Plan #2 for 1995. The Plan calls for the consolidation of the State's energy functions and programs into a single department, the expanded and newly titled Department of Energy and Conservation. The Plan is being submitted to you in conformance with the provision of Section 12080.2 of the Government Code.

After careful consideration and wide consultation with many Californians, I have found this reorganization to be in the public interest. The consolidation of the energy functions of the Department of Conservation and the California Energy Commission is long overdue. The merger of these two entities into the Department of Energy Conservation will create a primary point of accountability for the State's energy programs; allow for more rapid deployment of coordinated government action to meet California's energy needs; and, lead to the reduction of overlapping and the redundant bureaucracies.

While this reorganization transfers functions to the Department of Energy and Conservation, it does not abolish any functions. This reorganization does provide for the appointment of state officials, particularly the Director of Energy and Conservation and declare the appointment of such officers to be in the public interest in order to effectively implement this reorganization.
