Veto Message—Assembly Bill No. 276

Governor's Office, Sacramento
June 5, 1996

To the Members of the California Assembly:

I am returning Assembly Bill No. 276 without my signature.

This bill would require counties and districts covered by the County Employees Retirement Law of 1937, with the exception of Los Angeles County, to provide organizations representing retired employees with notice and an opportunity to comment on proposed changes to their health care coverage.

Nothing in existing law prevents this type of communication between various interested parties, including those representing retired employees. In fact, there are several notice requirements already mandated as part of the collective bargaining process which can be used by any interested individual or group. In contrast, a mandate such as this has a strong potential for lengthening the time required to conduct collective bargaining. Finally, enactment of this legislation could set a precedent for other interested parties to seek the same consideration, complicating an already cumbersome and difficult process.
