- 7. The Committee on Rules shall consist of the following 11 members:
- (a) The Chair, appointed by the Speaker, who shall be from the same party as the Speaker.

(b) Five members who shall be elected by the caucus of the same party as the Speaker.

(c) Five members who shall be elected by the caucus of the party other than that of the Speaker, one of whom shall be designated by that caucus as the Vice Chair of the committee.

The Committee on Rules shall have the power to refer each bill and house resolution to a committee.

The Committee on Rules shall have general direction over the Assembly Chamber and the rooms set aside for the use of the Assembly, including rooms for use by Members as private offices.

ROGAN MOTION NO. 2 TO AMEND RULES

Assembly Member Rogan moved that paragraphs 1 and 2 of Assembly Rule 9, as contained in the rules adopted by the Assembly by motion on June 5, 1995, be amended to read:

9. The membership of every standing committee, including the Committee on Rules, shall have one more member of the majority party than of the minority party. The term "majority party," for purposes of these rules, means the party with the greater number of Members in the Assembly, as determined by party registration.

Was Speaker Allen not earlier recognized to speak on the motion before the Body?

Reply by Acting Speaker Goldsmith

The Acting Speaker replied that Speaker Allen had participated in debate on the previous motion by Assembly Member Rogan.

Point of Order

Assembly Member Morrow arose to the following point of order: That Speaker Allen did speak on the motion currently before the Body.

Ruling by Acting Speaker Goldsmith

The Acting Speaker ruled the point of order well-taken based upon subsequent information, and that, without objection, Speaker Allen would be permitted to speak a second time on the motion.

Objection was raised.

Point of Information

Speaker Allen arose to the following point of information:

That the debate was not on point to remarks she made earlier in debate.

Motion to Table Rogan Motion No. 2 to Amend Rules

Assembly Member Hannigan moved that Motion No. 2 by Assembly Member Rogan be laid upon the table.

Assembly Member Napolitano seconded the motion.

Point of Order

Assembly Member Rogan arose to the following point of order:

That he had not been permitted time to open debate on his Motion No. 2 to amend the rules.

Ruling by Acting Speaker Goldsmith

PRINGLE MOTION TO AMEND RULES

Assembly Member Pringle moved that the rules adopted by the Assembly by motion on June 5, 1995, be amended to read:

17. Any Member elected to an incompatible office shall be deemed to have resigned his or her office in the Assembly on the tenth day after the Secretary of State issues the certificate of election unless the Member has resigned earlier.

For the purposes of these rules, an incompatible office is one in which the term of that office begins prior to the current legislative term concluding.

Assembly Member Rogan seconded the motion.

Parliamentary Inquiry

Assembly Member Isenberg arose to the following parliamentary inquiry:

Is there not language in the rules which requires members elected to an incompatible office to resign their Assembly seat on the 10th day after their certification?

Reply by Acting Speaker Goldsmith

The Acting Speaker replied that such language is in House Resolution No. 10 and based upon that would be usage and precedent of the House.

Point of Order

Assembly Member Pringle arose to the following point of order:

That the motion before the Body on June 5, 1995 was a motion to substitute for the rules adopted in House Resolution No. 10; and further, if the Chair rules that the rules under House Resolution No. 10 are in effect and are custom and precedent of the House except for those elements addressed in rules adopted on June 5, 1995, he would withdraw his motion.

Ruling by Acting Speaker Goldsmith

The Acting Speaker ruled the point of order well-taken; that the language contained in the last paragraph of Assembly Member Pringle's proposed amendment is not contained in House Resolution No. 10 and the motion by Assembly Member Pringle is therefore in order.

Parliamentary Inquiry

Assembly Member Pringle arose to the following parliamentary inquiry:

Are all elements of the rules contained in House Resolution No. 10 in force except for those elements which were adopted on June 5, 1995 as a substitute set of rules?

Reply by Acting Speaker Goldsmith

The Acting Speaker declined to reply to the parliamentary inquiry, and suggested Assembly Member Pringle proceed with his motion to amend the rules.

Parliamentary Inquiry

Assembly Member Burton arose to the following parliamentary inquiry:

Is it not clear that the rules adopted on June 5, 1995 were amendments to House Resolution No. 10 and not a substitute for the rules contained in House Resolution No. 10; and that unless a rule in House Resolution No. 10 was specifically replaced by rules adopted on June 5, 1995, House Resolution No. 10 is an operating rule of this House?

Reply by Acting Speaker Goldsmith

The Acting Speaker cited the motion by Assembly Member Isenberg contained in the June 5, 1995 Journal (page 2000) and stated it as the basis for his previous ruling.
