Adjournment in Memory of Ella Fitzgerald

Over the weekend, the world lost one of its greatest jazz singers. Ella Fitzgerald, who died peacefully in her Beverly Hills home on Saturday at age 78.

Her death closes the book on the most prolific era in jazz singing where she and three other great performers—Billie Holliday, Sara Vaughn, and Carmen McRea—dominated the jazz vocal world.

Ella was described as "The First Lady of Song", "A singer's singer" (Frank Sinatra), "Flawless", and "The greatest singer on the planet" (Mel Torme).

Her range of two octaves and a sixth was envied by opera singers across the world; her control was coveted by countless musicians.

Ella recorded more than 200 albums in her lifetime.

Peerless in her fame, Ella had an award named after her—called Ella"—and received more honors than musician—male or female. Among them are 13 grammy awards, a Kennedy Center honor for lifetime achievement in performing arts, and a Grammy Hall of Fame award.

She was voted best female jazz singer in 18 consecutive *Downbeat* magazine polls as well as polls by Metronome.

Ella was so great when she sought formal vocal training early in her career, a music teacher turned her away afraid of spoiling her rare

Leonard Feather, the late Los Angeles Times critic, said of her "If there was one artist whose work stood tall among all these giants, it was Ella Fitzgerald. Never had there been a more moving example of the spirit, beauty, beat, and total vocal control of which a jazz singer is capable. Ella can do anything to a melody except damage."
