Governor's Message Reorganization Plan No. 3 of 1995

Governor's Office, Sacramento June 16, 1995

The Honorable Doris Allen Speaker of the Assembly and the Members of the Assembly State Capitol, Room 219 Sacramento, California

Dear Assembly Members: It is my pleasure to submit to you and the Legislature, Reorganization Plan #3 for 1995. The Plan calls for the consolidation of the Office of the State Fire Marshal into the Department of Forestry and Fire Protection. The Plan is being submitted to you in conformance with the provision of Section 12080.2 of the Government Code.

After careful consideration based on the report of the Fire Services Task Force (created under Executive Order W-45-93) as well as discussions with various interested parties, I have found the consolidation of these two departments to be in the public interest. This reorganization will result in more efficient fire services to the citizens of California.

Specifically, it will allow for integration of existing activities by both departments in the areas of fire prevention and training, and the elimination of redundant and overlapping activities. Furthermore, the Plan does not abolish any existing functions or modify current statutory responsibilities of either entity.
