Members of the Assembly: As requested by the Joint Legislative Audit Committee, the Bureau of State Audits presents its audit report concerning the management of county investment pools by county treasurers. This report concludes that several counties employ at least one of three investment strategies we consider too risky. These high-risk strategies include excessive concentrations of structured notes, overuse of reverse repurchase agreements, and holding too many long-term securities. Additionally, three counties utilized agents who are also custodians to make investments that are not required to be recorded in accounting records or disclosed to participants.
