SPECIAL MEMORIAL CEREMONY

The following remarks were offered by Assembly Member Mickey Conroy, of the 71st Assembly District:

Today I have the sad duty of asking all of us—members of the Assembly and visitors—to pause and remember the Americans who were killed by the bombing this week in Saudi Arabia.

The color guard from McClellan Air Force Base will present the colors, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance and the playing of Taps.

As a former Marine and veteran of the Vietnam War, I fully appreciate the sacrifice of these Americans who were killed in Saudi Arabia. They willingly placed themselves in harm's way to carry out our nation's role as leader of the free world.

By accepting an assignment in a dangerous part of the world, they followed in a long and noble American tradition—a commitment to keeping the peace and preserving freedom around the world.

Our prayers go out to the families of the dead, especially to the family of Airman First Class Justin R. Wood of Modesto, the one Californian who was killed in the blast.

We cannot make up for the loss felt by Airman Wood's family—or the families of the other brave Americans who died far from home. But we can promise to keep their memories close to our hearts. And we pray that their cowardly killers are brought to justice.
