Dear Secretary Strock: Last week I learned that you agreed to implement a policy that is similar to my bill AB 1659. First, you are to be congratulated for taking this much needed step to help reform California's environmental regulatory climate. Second, since this proposal is similar to AB 1659, I have opted not to seek further legislative action on this issue until Cal-EPA's ability to carry out such a policy is assessed.

The approach espoused in AB 1659 and Assemblyman Miller's proposed budget control language is a reasonable approach. This policy can be traced to Governor Wilson's Executive Order W-127-95 and President Clinton's Executive Order 12866 of 1993.

I have notified the support and opposition of AB 1659 that this or any such bill authored by myself next year will have to wait given your decision. In retrospect, the internal policy that you are proposing—provided that it reflects AB 1659—may be the best option. By assessing the operational strengths and weaknesses of the policy, a better legislative solution can be crafted if need be.

I look forward to seeing your proposed Cal-EPA policy and look forward to reviewing its success next legislative session.
