## **REQUEST FOR UNANIMOUS CONSENT TO PRINT IN JOURNAL**

Assembly Member Sher was granted unanimous consent that the following statement of legislative intent be printed in the Journal:

## Legislative Intent—Assembly Bill No. 1413

July 10, 1995

E. Dotson Wilson Chief Clerk of the Assembly State Capitol—Room 3196

Dear Mr. Wilson: I respectfully request that this letter be inserted in the Assembly Journal.

It is my intent, as author of AB 1413, to exclude the lower reaches of both Mill and Deer Creeks from the provisions of the bill because the Mill and Deer Creek Watershed Conservancies have assured me that existing water rights decrees make it virtually impossible and unlikely that new dams, diversions or water impoundment facilities will ever be constructed along these stream segments.

I also agreed to exclude the lower reaches on both creeks because of voluntary efforts undertaken by the landowners to provide water to aid migration of Spring-run chinook salmon. Landowners in the Mill Creek watershed have already entered into a contractual agreement whereby the State of California provides groundwater to farmers in exchange for farmers' leaving an equal amount of natural flow in the stream during critical periods of the spring migration of Spring-run chinook salmon.

Water rights holders on Deer Creek are currently cooperating with the Departments of Water Resources, and Fish and Game, to similarly develop alternative water resources and provide fishery flows during the spawning season for Spring-run chinook salmon. The Deer Creek Irrigation District and Stanford-Vina Ranch Irrigation Company have cooperated in making voluntary flow releases at the request of the Department of Fish and Game (DFG) for the past five years. Efforts are underway to formalize the availability of fish migration flows through a water exchange agreement between DFG, the Department of Water Resources and the two water agencies.

For these reasons, I have deferred to the wishes of the affected landowners by limiting the provisions of AB 1413 to the upper reaches of both Mill and Deer Creeks.

## **REQUEST FOR UNANIMOUS CONSENT TO PRINT IN JOURNAL**

On behalf of Assembly Member Ducheny, Assembly Member Brulte was granted unanimous consent that the following statement of legislative intent be printed in the Journal:

## Legislative Intent—Assembly Bill No. 1298

July 10, 1995

Honorable Doris Allen Speaker of the Assembly State Capitol, Room 219 Sacramento, California

Dear Madame Speaker: I respectfully submit this letter in an effort to clarify the meaning of recent amendments to my Assembly Bill 1298. I do so in order to address confusion expressed about how my bill would impact school districts, community college districts, county offices of education and their respective employees which are subject to coverage by this legislation.

Sections 1 through 15, inclusive, of the May 30th version of the bill simply are intended to clarify the existing eligibility requirements for membership in the existing Defined Benefit Plan provided and

administered by the State Teachers Retirement System (STRS) pursuant to Education Code Section 22000 et seq. It has never been my intent to expand the current membership eligibility requirements of the existing STRS Defined Benefit Plan. In addition, the sponsors of this measure, the State Teachers Retirement System, have assured me that in proposing this legislation they do not intend to expand membership eligibility of the STRS Defined Benefit Plan. I believe that AB 1298, as amended May 30, 1995, neither expands nor restricts membership eligibility under the existing Defined Benefit Plan and is consistent with current law. The purpose of Sections 1 through 15, inclusive, of AB 1298 is to make membership eligibility subject to a functional definition as opposed to restricting membership eligibility by exclusion based upon enumerated positions.

As amended May 30th, Section 16 of the bill, which proposes to establish the STRS' Cash Balance Plan, is designed to ensure that the governing boards of school districts, community college districts and county offices of education make the decision as to whether or not that educational entity will offer the Cash Balance Plan to its part-time employees. This section, however, does not specify how the governing boards go about making their decision, ie. does not require or preclude the decision from being made as part of any collective bargaining process, nor does it preclude a board from offering other part-time employee retirement benefit options along with the Cash Balance Plan. The recent amendment to proposed Section 26000 of Part 14 governing the STRS' Cash Balance Plan provides that if such an educational entity decides not to offer the STRS' Cash Balance Plan, then the provisions of AB 1298's Section 16 are not applicable to that educational entity and have no impact on its employees. These amendments can only be interpreted to make the STRS' Cash Balance Plan an option for school districts, community college districts and county offices of education.

Amendments to Section 16 relating to the proposed employer and participant responsibilities governing the STRS' Cash Balance Plan ensures that when a governing board of a school district, community college district, or county office of education elects by formal action to provide the STRS' Cash Balance Plan, that any individual subject to coverage of that plan has the right following commencement of his or her employment to choose between the STRS' Cash Balance Plan and an alternative retirement plan, if offered by the educational entity. The intent of these amendments is to provide choice to such employees in those instances where the educational entity has decided to provide competing options for those employees.

While AB 1298 is a complex bill, I am carrying the measure in order to benefit part-time employees of school districts, community college districts, and county offices of education. It is my hope that AB 1298 puts forward a viable, attractive and competitive part-time employee retirement benefit.

I trust that this clarification, regarding both the current STRS' Defined Benefit Plan and my proposed STRS' Cash Balance Plan, will alleviate any confusion as to my, or my sponsors, intent with this legislation. Thank you for allowing me this opportunity to address these matters.
