Legislative Intent—Assembly Bill No. 729

Dear Mr. Wilson: I want to place this letter in the Assembly Daily Journal to clarify my intent in introducing Assembly Bill 729, which is currently awaiting action on the Senate floor. The bill was introduced for the purpose of expanding upon one of the reasons for which permanent certificated employees of school districts may be dismissed from employment.

Assembly Bill 729 replaces the reason of "incompetency" with that of "unsatisfactory performance" on the list of enumerated causes for permanent teacher dismissal. To maintain consistency in the

Education Code, the bill also substitutes the word "performance" for "competency" in the code sections addressing certificated employee evaluation and assessment (the so-called "Stull Act," found at Education Code sections 44660 et seq.).

The singular purpose of this legislation is to enable the dismissal of teachers who are not meeting performance standards established by the governing board. The bill therefore establishes a standard less than incompetency (which means not qualified or not able), in favor of one which means less than adequate performance. The intent of the bill was to increase, rather than diminish, a district's ability to dismiss unsatisfactory employees. A district will no longer need to prove a teacher is beyond remediation. Rather, it need only demonstrate the teacher is not meeting established standards of performance. This change adds consistency to the Education Code, since "unsatisfactory performance" is already the standard for dismissal (not release) of probationary certificated employees under Education Code section 44948.3.

Incompetency would, in effect, still be grounds for permanent teacher dismissal, since that level of performance would more than meet the "unsatisfactory performance" standard now in the Education Code. In this regard, it is important to note, as stated in the Legislative Counsel's Digest for the bill, that incompetency was merely "eliminated . . . as one of the enumerated causes for dismissal of a permanent employee." (Emphasis added.) Thus, "incompetency" remains as the most extreme example of, but is now subsumed by the cause of "unsatisfactory performance."

When the bill was heard in the Senate Education Committee on July 5, 1995, discussion clarified that the bill makes no changes to the evaluation processes with which school districts must already comply under the Stull Act, and that the intent of the bill is to merely establish an additional standard for dismissal as explained above.

Before approving the bill, the Committee did not envision or discuss the bill as having any impact on a governing board's authority to establish evaluation and performance standards under the Stull Act, or on a board's established managerial discretion to decide whether and when to issue notices of unsatisfactory performance and dismissal, pursuant to code sections regulating teacher dismissal. Therefore, the scope of negotiations under the Educational Employment Relations Act (Government Code section 3540 et seq.) remains unaffected and unchanged by the bill and, as such, is limited to "procedures" related to evaluation, as opposed to the substance thereof, or to a board's utilization of disciplinary procedures under the Education Code.

I hope this letter will clarify any concern that educators may have in implementing AB 729. By establishing a new and less demanding standard for the dismissal of unsatisfactory teachers, I believe the bill significantly enhances a district's ability to improve classroom education for students.
