Legislative Intent—Assembly Bill No. 3483

August 8, 1996

RE: AB 3483—Clarification of Legislative Intent Regarding Provisions Eliminating Retroactive Rebate Demands by Department of Health Services

Dear Speaker Pringle: As Co-Chairman of the Joint Conference Committee on the Budget, I am writing to request that this letter be published in the Journal so as to resolve any possible questions as to the intent and effect of the provisions of AB 3483 relating to the elimination of legal authority to demand rebates retroactive to any date prior to July 1, 1996, in the Medi-Cal Drug Discount Program.

From July 1, 1994, to June 30, 1996, Welfare and Institutions Code Section 14105.335 required a 10 percent supplemental rebate from pharmaceutical manufacturers that participated in the contract drug program for *all* drugs reimbursed by the Medi-Cal program, whether those drugs were readily available on the Medi-Cal "list of contract drugs," or whether those drugs were subject to cumbersome "prior authorization" requirements. That statute *expired* pursuant to its own terms on June 30, 1996. That sunset date was neither deleted, nor extended—that statute *expired*.

As part of the bipartisan, negotiated resolution of the Budget Act of 1996, the Assembly and Senate conferees agreed, and the full Assembly and Senate ratified the decision, that a new, but temporary requirement for a 10 percent supplemental rebate be enacted, and that the administrative practice developed by the Department of Health Services of requiring rebates of contracting manufacturers retroactive to July 1, 1994, be terminated.

The Department of Health Services has elected to completely ignore the plain effect of the new statute, to disregard the announcements made by the Budget Conference Committee, and the comments made by Republican and Democrat legislators presenting the Budget trailer bill-AB 3483, and to ignore the analyses produced by both houses of the Legislature. In its letter dated July 25, 1996, the Department of Health Services advised pharmaceutical manufacturers that a non-negotiable, standard contract prepared "to implement this new law," requires drug manufacturers to provide the ten percent supplemental rebate for the period beginning July 1, 1994! According to the Department's letter, only by submitting to these non-negotiable terms, which abrogate, ignore and disregard the law the Legislature enacted, can pharmaceutical manufacturers enter into contracts with the Department of Health Services for the addition of drugs to the Medi-Cal list.

Let there be no question on any party's part that the clear, unequivocal intent and effect of *new* Welfare and Institutions Code Section 14105.335, which became operative on July 1, 1996, succeeding the former statute of the same number which *expired* on its own terms, was to eliminate any perceived or actual legal authority for the Department of Health Services to demand rebates retroactive to any date prior to July 1, 1996, based on the provisions of the former Section 14105.335, and to extend the authority for the Department to compel payment of any supplemental rebate only to January 1, 1997.

My thanks to you and the Members of the Assembly for your consideration and cooperation in setting the record straight for any party who may not have understood the effect of the expiration of the old law, and the enactment of the new law.
