WHEREAS, The Honorable Curtis R. Tucker, Jr., the distinguished Assembly Member who has represented the 51st Assembly District for the past seven years, is drawing to a close his tenure in office, upon this occasion he is deserving of highest commendations for his exemplary record of dedicated service to his constituents and the State of California; and

WHEREAS, Curtis Tucker was first elected to the California State Assembly in 1989 as the representative of the 51st Assembly District, which includes Inglewood, Hawthorne, Lennox, Lawndale, Westchester, and portions of South Central Los Angeles; and

WHEREAS, A lifelong resident of Inglewood, Curtis Tucker earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in history from California State

University, Dominguez Hills, and he amassed a vast knowledge of state and local community affairs; and

WHEREAS, During his tenure in the California State Assembly, Curtis Tucker has established an impressive record of legislative accomplishments that have impacted individuals throughout the state; and

WHEREAS, He has distinguished himself as Vice Chairperson of the Governmental Organization Committee and as a member of the Health Committee and Insurance Committee; and
