Dear Mr. Wilson: This letter is to clarify the intent of the Legislature in approving AB 3229 (Chapter 134, Statutes 1996) and establishing the "Supplemental Local Law Enforcement Services Fund" (SLESF).

Government Code Section 30062(a), created in AB 3229, reads as follows:

"(a) Except as required by paragraphs (1) and (2) of subdivision (b) of Section 30061, moneys allocated from a SLESF to a recipient entity shall be expended exclusively to provide front line law enforcement services. These moneys shall supplement existing services, and shall not be used to supplant existing funding for law enforcement services provided by that entity." (Emphasis added)

The intended construction of that language is to establish two requirements, contained in the two sentences of the subsection respectively.

The first sentence of (a) establishes that the moneys allocated from the SLESF fund is intended to be spent on front line law enforcement services, subject to the provisions of (1) and (2) of subdivision (b) of Section 30061. Those provisions require that 12 ½% of the SLESF funds be allocated to the county sheriff for

county jail construction and operation and that 12 ½% of the SLESF funds be allocated to the district attorney for criminal prosecution. This first sentence then details to which functions and in what amounts the SLESF funds are to be allocated.

The second sentence of (a) is non-supplantation language, specifying that "these moneys [SLESF funds] shall supplement existing *services*". As indicated in my letter of August 26, this requirement exists without reference to existing *funding levels*. Therefore, it was the intent of the Legislature that local governments would set their 1996–1997 funding levels to maintain existing service levels, without consideration of the SLESF funds. It is to this base level of support, defined again by the services provided and not the dollar amount, that the SLESF funds are intended to be added.

Moreover, it was clearly the intent of the Legislature that the non-supplantation language of the second sentence applies to *all* of the programs which receive SLESF moneys, meaning programs receiving moneys under paragraphs (1) and (2) of subdivision (b) of Section 30061 as well as front line law enforcement services. Any reading of the subsection which attempts to construe that the reference to "these moneys" in the second sentence applies only to the funding provided for the "front line law enforcement services" of the first sentence is erroneous and nonsensical. The "moneys" to which the nonsupplantation language of the second sentence refers is clearly the SLESF moneys generally.

In sum, as the very name of the program signifies and as was clarified in my letter of August 26, the SLESF was created to "supplement" services which were already being provided by local governments. Its supplemental function was intended to apply equally to all fund recipients.
