Dear Madame Speaker: I am the author of Assembly Bill 2936, Chapter 208, 1994. The legislative intent of this law, as part of the integrity of racing program, was to enforce penalties against parties who used certain prohibited drug substances to enhance the performance of a racehorse.

It was not the legislative intent that a forfeiture of any purse, award, or record for a race be automatic upon any finding, no matter how small, of a prohibited drug substance. If that drug substance was determined to have had the significant possibility of having any effect on the animal, disqualification should occur.

As in any law, the persons applying the law must balance the equities of the situation in order to determine whether or not that law should be applied to its fullest extent under that set of facts.
