REQUEST FOR UNANIMOUS CONSENT TO PRINT IN JOURNAL

Assembly Member Campbell was granted unanimous consent that the following statement of legislative intent be printed in the Journal:

Dear Messrs. Rollens and Wilson: We, the undersigned, hereby submit this letter as a supplement to the SB 756 (Petris) proposed conference report to clarify the intent of our actions as members of the SB 756 conference committee.

The conference committee was convened to consider the subject matter of several bills relating to modifying the property tax shifts from certain local agencies to the Educational Revenue Augmentation Fund (ERAF). Subsequent to a staff briefing on the statutory history of the property tax shifts and an opportunity for a Department of Finance representative to comment on the various proposals, we deliberated over how each of the proposals ought to be considered.

Senator Leslie, who chaired the Conference Committee, suggested, with all of the other conferees concurring, that the subject matter of most of the ERAF-related bills be consolidated into six different Senate bills, since the Senate bills are already in the second house. These six bills, most representing bipartisan proposals, are as follows:

- SB 756 (Petris), the bill before the conference committee, will be amended to delete all of the existing provisions and require that the property tax shifts from certain county service areas that engage in police protection activities be reduced by \$9 million over a three-year period commencing with the 1995–96 fiscal year. This proposal currently is the subject of AB 337 (Campbell).
- SB 124 (Leslie), which reduces Butte County's property tax shift to the ERAF by the total amount of its fire protection revenues, would now include provisions currently contained in SB 652 (O'Connell) which requires that 25% of San Luis Obispo County's property tax shift be from its state-assessed roll.
- SB 203 (Leslie) is a bill that limits the allocation of "excess" funds remaining in the Marin County ERAF to the county superintendent of schools for special education programs to \$5 million in the 1995–96 fiscal year only. This bill also exempts Mono County from the allocation of "excess" revenues remaining in its ERAF to the county superintendent of schools for special education programs for the 1995–96 fiscal year only.
- SB 84 (Greene), which excludes certain one-time development fee revenue from the calculation of the 10% cap on the 1992–93 property tax loss for the Sunrise Recreation and Park District (Sacramento), would now

include similar provisions for Greater Vallejo Recreation District (Solano County) with respect to one-time development fee revenues and for the Monterey County Regional Park District with respect to one-time state grant revenues. These latter two provisions currently are contained in AB 351 (V. Brown) and AB 439 (McPherson), respectively.

- SB 6XX (Kelley), which exempts single-county transit districts from the 1992–93 property tax shift, would phase-in tax shift relief over three fiscal years.
- SB 830 (Craven) consolidates the property tax shifts of the City of Laguna Niguel and the Laguna Niguel Community Services District (CSD), and will phase-in tax relief over three years. The bill will additionally incorporate the tax shift reductions in SB 229 (Boatwright) for cities which shift an amount in excess of their AB 8 bailout, and SB 366 (Rogers) which reduces the 1992–93 property tax shift for CSDs that provide police protection and personal safety activities.

We unanimously agreed that all of these bills must contain a state General Fund appropriation to backfill the property tax revenue losses for the affected community college districts. However, this provision would not apply to SB 203.

Lastly, all of us emphasized the need and support continuing discussions on how to revise or reverse the property tax shifts to the

ERAF and the inequities created by the shifts.

We hope this supplemental conference report clarifies the intent of the actions we took relative to the current ERAF-related proposals and future discussions concerning the property tax shifts.
