Members of the Assembly: As requested by the Joint Legislative Audit Committee, the Bureau of State Audits presents its response to specific questions related to the commitments of the Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (MTA). This report concludes that the MTA's long-term outstanding debt was approximately \$2.9 billion at June 30, 1995, and annual debt service requirements were approximately 19 percent of the MTA's operating expenses. According to its treasurer, the MTA plans to issue approximately \$140 million in new long-term debt during fiscal year 1995-96. In addition, the MTA has pledged fare box revenues to finance the workers' compensation funding program and a new 26-story headquarters building. Finally, according to the treasurer, the MTA used approximately \$282 million of certain debt issues totaling \$1.5 billion for the construction of the Metro Red Line.

REQUEST FOR UNANIMOUS CONSENT TO PRINT IN JOURNAL

Assembly Member Valerie Brown was granted unanimous consent that the following communication be printed in the Journal:

September 13, 1995

We, the undersigned, are opposed to any effort that would replace state pre-emption of taxes over alcoholic beverages by granting counties the power to levy a consumer tax or “tippler” tax.

We believe that an additional tax on the consumption of on-premise beverages would place an unfair and economically shortsighted burden on California businesses that manufacture and sell wine, beer and spirits as well as our state’s entire hospitality industry.

Alcoholic beverages are already taxed at a rate far exceeding other commodities in California. In 1991, federal taxes were doubled on beer and California’s state beer tax was increased 500% from 4 cents to 20 cents per gallon. Federal taxes on wine were increased from 17 cents to \$1.07 per gallon and our state’s wine tax was increased 2,000% from 1 cent to 20 cents per gallon.

The results of these increases have led to a 10% decline in sales and the forced layoffs of industry workers. A 10% tippler tax at this time

is estimated to depress sales an additional 5%, resulting in a sales loss in excess of \$600 million statewide. That would represent a loss of approximately 2.4 million cases of beer sold and nearly 2 million bottles of wine. The economic ripple effect to other businesses would be unavoidable.

We believe that a tippler tax approach to budget management would represent one of the most unfair tax policies because it would hit hardest the lower- and middle-income consumers who are least able to shoulder the public burden. California beer consumers already pay state, federal and local taxes that add up to 30 cents per 12 oz. serving in an on-premise establishment. A 10% tippler tax would add an additional 25 cents, raising the total tax on a glass of beer to 55 cents.

We are also concerned over the additional levels of bureaucracy needed for the management and enforcement of patchwork tippler tax. The duplication, confusion and costs that have accompanied similar bureaucracies in other states that have experimented with local option taxes have proven to be problematic.

California voters have already rejected efforts to unfairly raise beverage taxes. In 1990, voters soundly defeated two ballot initiatives proposing higher taxes on wine, beer and spirits.

For these and other reasons, we strongly oppose placing an economically-ill-conceived and punitive burden on California consumers and targeted businesses through the form of a tippler tax.

Dear Mr. Wilson: I am submitting this letter to the Assembly Daily Journal to clarify my intentions with regard to AB 909 (Bowen), which was adopted by both Houses of the Legislature last night and signed into law by Governor Pete Wilson today.

AB 909 should not be construed to pre-empt any policy discussion that we should be engaging in relative to the future of our State parks. We owe all Californians an opportunity to debate whether the State or the local government where the beach or park is physically located should have the responsibility of making sure that our natural resources remain open and accessible to everyone. We also need a public discussion about how to balance fiscal realities with the need to keep our beaches and parks from being commercialized or developed in a way that undermines the entire purpose of maintaining the parks in their natural state.

The detailed restrictions in AB 909 provide citizens with the ability to make sure that the L.A. County beaches remain in their pristine condition. However, it's my hope that in 1996, we will take the time to examine the broader public policy implications of divestiture and

what they mean for the future of our State park system, rather than continuing to turn valuable State park properties over to local governments on a piecemeal basis.

Dear Mr. Wilson: The undersigned requests that the following be printed in the Journal.

Assembly Bill 1381 (Speier) revises, reforms, and expands the current Automotive Consumer Notification Act to Provide consumers with a more meaningful notice of a vehicle's history.

AB 1381 adds Section 1793.23 to the Civil Code and subdivisions (d) and (e) of that section require that a statutory notice form be given to the subsequent purchaser of a vehicle if the vehicle was reacquired by the vehicle's manufacturer in response to a request by the last retail owner or lessee of the vehicle that it be replaced or accepted for restitution because the vehicle did not conform to express warranties. However, it is not the intent of AB 1381 that the notice specified in subdivisions (d) and (e) of Civil Code Section 1793.23 be required in situations where a manufacturer repurchases a motor vehicle pursuant to the advertised terms of a "guaranteed repurchase plan" or "satisfaction program" offered by an automobile manufacturer, provided that the vehicle was neither alleged nor found to have a nonconformity that substantially impaired its use, value or safety.

A "guaranteed repurchase plan" or a "satisfaction program" such as those currently offered by Saturn and Oldsmobile, provide for the repurchase of a new motor vehicle for any customer satisfaction reason, including, but not limited to, dissatisfaction with a previously selected vehicle color, engine size, option package, etc. It is not the intent of AB 1381 that such plans or programs be construed as express warranties.

In addition, AB 1381 makes numerous cross-references to subdivision (d) of Civil Code Section 1793.2 regarding the obligation of a motor vehicle manufacturer to repair or replace new motor vehicles which fail to conform to the manufacturer's express warranty. Subdivision (d) of Civil Code Section 1793.2 contains both subparagraph (1) relating to consumer goods in general and subparagraph (2) relating only to new motor vehicles. It is my intent that all references to subdivision (d) of Civil Code Section 1793.2 in AB 1381 relate only to subparagraph (2) of subdivision (d). This is

consistent with the motor vehicle title branding and disclosure provisions of AB 1381 and should prevent any unintended interpretation that the provisions of AB 1381 extend to any consumer goods covered by the Song-Beverly Act.

Dear Mr. Wilson: I respectfully request that this letter be entered in the Daily Journal for the purpose of declaring my legislative intent in AB 733.

Section 2 of AB 733 provides in Section 4026.8 (a) (1) and (a) (2) that public water systems are under no obligation to supply funds for capital or operating costs to comply with AB 733. Section 4026.8 (h) provides a simplified procedure under which water systems regulated by the Public Utilities Commission may pass costs of fluoridation on to their ratepayers. It is my intention that subsection (h) shall be operative only when those water systems fluoridate in the absence of funding pursuant to 4026.8 (a) (1) or 4026.8 (a) (2).

Section 3 of AB 733 exempts minor alterations to utilities from California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) requirements. It is not my intent to exempt the construction of buildings which would otherwise be subject to CEQA.

Section 4 of AB 733 provides that no state reimbursement is required to public water systems for costs of fluoridation for the reason that the public water systems could recover the costs themselves and the additional reason that AB 733 applies to water systems generally. These standard disclaimers should not be construed as negating the other provisions of AB 733 which provide that public water systems are under no obligation to supply funds for capital or operating costs to comply with AB 733.

Dear Mr. Wilson: I am writing this letter to clarify the intent of my Assembly Bill 1374 of this legislative session.

AB 1374 is intended to require state agencies to allow payment to

be made to the agency by credit card or other payment device. This bill is intended to allow the market and the fiscal restraints of state agencies to determine what particular credit cards and payment devices will be accepted by any one agency or through master contracts entered into by the Department of General Services (DGS), and the terms under which a state agency shall accept payment by credit card or payment device.

AB 1374 allows DGS and other state agencies to enter into contracts necessary to implement this bill under existing state law and policies. This bill and that process are not intended to advantage any one credit card company or bank over another. Nothing in this bill is intended to prevent a state agency from accepting payment by one or more types of credit card or payment device without accepting payment by all types of credit cards or payment devices. Should DGS or any state agency be unable to enter into a contract with respect to any type of credit card or payment device on terms acceptable to the state agency or to DGS and the state agency as applicable, DGS and the agency would not be precluded from considering or accepting bids or proposals from other credit card companies or banks and entering into such contracts, so long as the greater good of the public is served.

Thank you for allowing me to clarify the intent of AB 1374.

Re: Implementation of AB 1024, Reporting Provisions Relating to the Repeal of "S" 803

Dear Speaker Setencich: As the author of AB 1024, which repeals an archaic and counterproductive provision in the existing Insurance Code, I wanted to express my opinion with regard to Senate amendments and implementation of this new statute. My legislation rewrites Section 803 which dates from 1935. This archaic statute prohibits an admitted insurer from reinsuring a nonadmitted insurer's California business. Many of the largest reinsurers in the country are admitted insurers and thus are prohibited for reinsuring nonadmitted insurers. Meanwhile, their international competitors aren't prohibited from pursuing this business opportunity.

I authored AB 1024 because I was convinced that the existing Section 803 was:

1. Restrictive from a solvency regulation perspective because it limits rather than enhances regulatory oversight of the reinsurance recoverable of the surplus lines companies operating in this state;
2. Obsolete from an enforcement standpoint since the state has enacted significant new regulatory provisions for surplus lines brokers and companies; and
3. Counterproductive from a solvency perspective because this section steers these companies to non-licensed reinsurers.

The Senate agreed with the substance of my legislation, but added some regulatory mandates that I have some concerns about. In fact, the Senate amendment mandates that a reporting provision remain in place rather than simply permitting that the department exercise appropriate regulatory oversight. The Senate amendment also allows the department to bypass the administrative rules process. I request that the department allow affected parties to review and comment on any new regulatory mandates prior to their implementation. The legislature should not encourage action bypassing the appropriate administrative rules process.

Advocates of this legislation had many discussion with the insurance department about this legislation and the department supports my goals. The department plans to monitor the implementation effort and will take enforcement action against unscrupulous companies that may try to circumvent the intent of the legislation. The Senate amendments mandate that the department take certain action. I believe that the department is fully capable on its own of implementing the legislation and monitoring compliance.

I oppose any effort by others to weigh down the implementation effort with burdensome reporting requirements.

For the record, I believe that the department has authority under sections 923 and 925 to require insurers to report pertinent aggregate financial information about reinsurance transactions. It is my understanding that the department will be implementing its monitoring efforts based on the provisions of section 923. This annual statement reporting mechanism will likely lead to an efficient and effective means of ensuring compliance. It is my intent that the department's enforcement actions meet common sense tests. For example, it is my intent that:

- Non-material subject transactions be exempted from any reporting mandates; materiality can be measured by the amount of aggregate premium ceded;
- Intercompany pooling agreements should be exempted from reporting requirements;
- The focus of the reporting mechanism should be on the effect of aggregate subject transactions filed quarterly or annually and not be on individual transaction by transaction reporting.

Furthermore, it is my belief that after the department has several years experience in enforcement of this section, the statute should be amended so that the insurance regulator may eliminate reporting requirements that are no longer necessary.

The legislature's action in approving Assembly Bill 1024 is a positive step forward. I appreciate the support of my colleagues on this legislation.

Dear Speaker Setencich: Congress is currently considering nearly 300 separate bills designed to consolidate hundreds of federal categorical programs into a few block grants. These block grants are likely to affect every one of our constituents as well as hundreds of important programs. If any one of the major block grant bills under serious consideration passes this year, California stands to lose millions of dollars and our precariously balanced state budget will be severely impacted.

I am authoring Assembly Bill 861 which is the first step toward addressing any federal block grant action. Because of amendments taken in the Senate, I have asked that AB 861 be placed in the hands of a Conference Committee to be taken up upon our return in January.

Congress is likely to act on any block grant legislation in late October or early November, with an October 1, 1995 effective date. Due to the difference in timing between our legislative calendar and that of the Congressional calendar, I intend to convene a working group of representatives of the Administration, the appropriate legislative fiscal and policy committees from both parties, and affected constituency groups to assist the Conference Committee in addressing any block grants enacted during the Interim Recess.

Thank you for your understanding and cooperation in this matter.

RE: AB 1868 (Katz)

Dear Chief Clerk Wilson: This letter is written to express the legislative intent of AB 1868 as it relates to the following issues:

1. *Extension of Existing Pipeline Systems*

AB 1868 applies to all public utility pipeline systems, that transport crude oil, or any fraction thereof, for which construction is completed on or after, January 1, 1996. Additionally, AB 1868 applies to that portion of a pipeline system that involves a major relocation along a substantially new alignment, if accomplished through the exercise of eminent domain. (See subdivision (h).)

AB 1868 shall apply to extensions of existing pipeline systems only to the extent that such extensions independently qualify as pipeline systems, within the meaning of AB 1868. In no event shall AB 1868 apply to the pre-existing pipeline system to which the newly-constructed extension attaches, unless a portion of it has been the subject of a major relocation as described above.

For example, assume that a forty mile pipeline system was constructed, and is being operated, before January 1, 1996, the effective date of AB 1868. After January 1, 1996, a ten mile extension is added to the pre-existing forty mile pipeline system. The newly-constructed 10 mile extension is covered by AB 1868 only if it is determined that the ten mile extension independently qualifies as pipeline system, as defined by subdivision (m) (3). If it is determined that the ten mile extension is, in fact, a pipeline system, the extension shall be subject to AB 1868. However, the forty mile pre-existing pipeline system, to which the ten mile extension attaches, shall not be subject to AB 1868.

If, on the other hand, it is determined that the newly-constructed, ten mile extension does not qualify as a "pipeline system," as defined in subdivision (m) (3), neither the pre-existing forty mile pipeline system, nor the ten mile extension shall be subject to AB 1868.

In this regard, the definition of "pipeline system" contains two essential elements. (See subdivision (m) (3).)

The first element is that some or all of the components and appurtenances listed in subdivision (m) (3), and possibly other components as well, as may be necessary or convenient in order for a pipeline to function as intended and serve a commercial purpose must be present, and it is

this collective assemblage (completed on or after January 1, 1996) that constitutes a "pipeline system."

The second element is that the *collective assemblage* (i.e., an extension or a new independent line) must be constructed at substantially the same time for the same purpose.

These two elements, operating together, mean that the components of the collective assemblage which together constitute a functional pipeline must be built at substantially the same time and for the same purpose in order for the newly constructed pipeline or and extension to an existing pipeline system to constitute a "pipeline system" subject to the provisions of AB 1868.

2. *Post-closure Financial Responsibility*

AB 1868 recognizes that liability to landowners may be discovered after the cessation of pipeline operations as a result of crude oil, or any fraction thereof, that leaked or was released from the pipeline during, or after, pipeline operations, but before the line was flushed out and properly closed.

Accordingly, subdivision (k) requires evidence of financial responsibility sufficient to fund post closure clean-up costs and that such evidence of financial responsibility be 15 percent of the amount of financial responsibility required in subdivision (j). This financial responsibility must be maintained for a period of four years from the date the pipeline is fully idled pursuant to a closure plan approved by the State Fire Marshal.

It is the intent of the Legislature that subdivision (j) and (k) create a comprehensive financial responsibility scheme so that no gaps in the provision of evidence of financial responsibility shall occur between the time the pipeline is operating and four years from the date the pipeline is fully idled pursuant to a closure plan approved by the State Fire Marshal.
