# The Assembly History

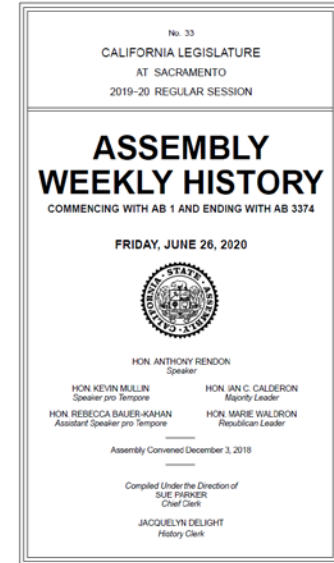
A compilation of all actions taken on every measure introduced in the Assembly.

## Weekly History

- Printed at the end of each legislative week.
- Reflects all actions taken on all measures from the beginning of the legislative session.

## Final History

- Printed at the end of the two-year session.
- Reflects the history of all measures for the entire session.
- Includes various charts, tables, and other useful information.



## Legislative Information System (LIS)

- Information on all Assembly measures is entered into the Assembly History System by the History Clerks.
- LIS is updated with the new data immediately. Capitol and District staff can choose to subscribe to bills and get email alerts when this information is posted.
- The public's LegInfo website is updated nightly with the information input that day ([leginfo.legislature.ca.gov](http://leginfo.legislature.ca.gov))

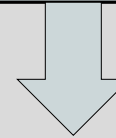

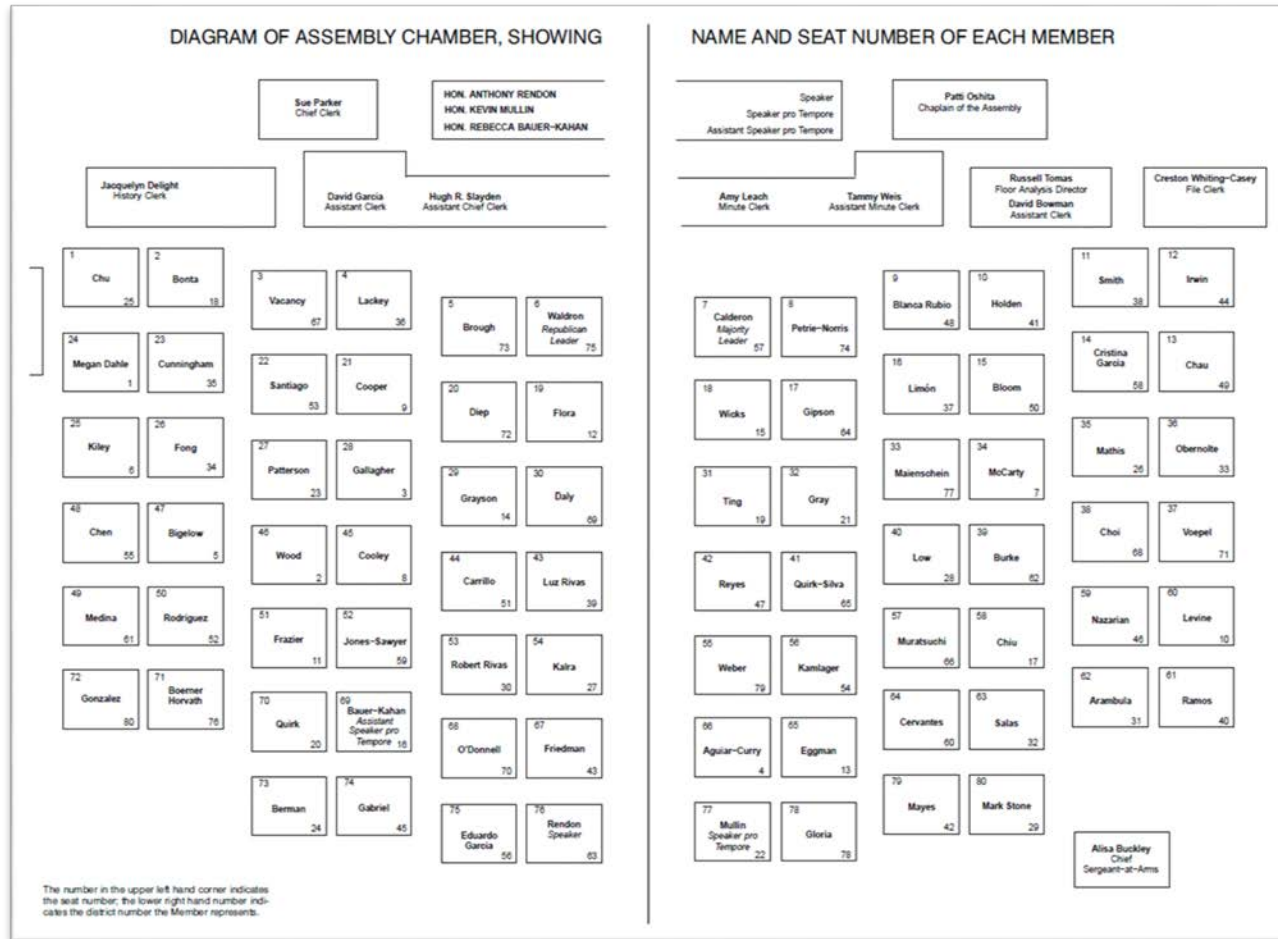
