The following bills were introduced and read the first time:

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 101—Anderson. An act to amend Section 3010 of the Elections Code, relating to elections.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 102—Smyth. An act to add Section 5006.43 to the Public Resources Code, relating to parks.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 103—De León. An act to add Section 62.3 to the Revenue and Taxation Code, relating to taxation, to take effect immediately, tax levy.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 104—Charles Calderon. An act to amend Sections 17085, 17504, and 17506 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, relating to taxation, to take effect immediately, tax levy.
