ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 167—Blanca Rubio. An act to add Sections 8242 and 8243 to the Education Code, relating to childcare and development services.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 168—Aguiar-Curry. An act to amend 65913.4 of the Government Code, relating to housing.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 169—Lackey (Coauthors: Choi and Mathis). An act to amend Sections 13955 and 13957 of the Government Code, and to amend Sections 600.2 and 600.5 of the Penal Code, relating to guide, signal, and service dogs, and making an appropriation therefor.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 170—Gonzalez. An act to add Section 12940.2 to the Government Code, relating to employment.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 171—Gonzalez (Coauthor: Bonta). An act to amend Section 230 of the Labor Code, relating to employment.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 172—Voepel. An act to amend Sections 22406, 22407, 24600, 24607, and 34506.4 of the Vehicle Code, relating to speed limits.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 173—Chau. An act to amend Sections 18116.1 and 18550.1 of the Health and Safety Code, and to amend Section 5832 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, relating to mobilehomes.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 174—Wood. An act to add Section 100504.1 to the Government Code, and to add Section 17052.10 to the Revenue and Taxation Code, relating to taxation, to take effect immediately, tax levy.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 175—Gipson. An act to amend Section 16001.9 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, relating to foster care.
