The following bills were introduced and read the first time:

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 133—Galgiani. An act to add Chapter 20.1 (commencing with Section 2704.25) to Division 3 of the Streets and Highways Code, relating to high-speed rail.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 134—Dickinson (Principal coauthor: Senator Steinberg). An act to add Section 1486 to the Water Code, relating to water resources.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 135—Hagman. An act to amend, repeal, and add Section 39510 of the Health and Safety Code, relating to air pollution.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 136—Beall. An act to amend Section 2881 of the Public Utilities Code, relating to telecommunications.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 137—Portantino. An act to amend Section 1367.65 of, and to add Section 1367.651 to, the Health and Safety Code, and to amend Section 10123.81 of, and to add Section 10123.815 to, the Insurance Code, relating to health care coverage.
