REQUEST FOR UNANIMOUS CONSENT TO PRINT IN JOURNAL

Assembly Member Blumenfield was granted unanimous consent that the following statement of legislative intent be printed in the Journal:

Dear Mr. Wilson: I have authored Assembly Bill 1196 to enhance the California False Claims Act as an enforcement tool to combat fraudulent claims with state and local governments by unscrupulous contractors.

As initially drafted, this bill would have included a provision codifying the well-accepted rule that a complaint-in-intervention filed by the government relates back for statute of limitations purposes to the initial complaint filed by the *qui tam* plaintiff on the government's behalf. This provision was removed from the bill because it was declaratory of existing law and unnecessary, as California has long recognized relation back. (*Idding v. North Bay Construction* (1995) 39 Cal. App. 4th 1111, 1113.)

The recent amendments to the federal act did include a provision that was intended to clarify relation back under federal procedural law. (See 31 U.S.C. § 3731(c).) This provision was necessitated by a federal court decision interpreting former Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 15(c)(2). (See *U.S. v. Baylor Univ. Med. Ctr.* (2d Cir. 2006) 469 F.3d 263, 270.) There was no need for similar clarifying language in A.B. 1196 because California has never enacted a counterpart to former Federal Rule 15(c)(2).

In amending Section 4 of this act, the Legislature clarifies the meaning of language contained in the original version of the California False Claims Act ("CFCA"). The section does not change existing law, but rather clarifies that only the Attorney General and local prosecuting authorities with jurisdiction to act are "officials charged with the responsibility to act in the circumstances" as that phrase was used in the

original version of the CFCA. The section further clarifies that the three-year statute of limitations commences only upon discovery by the Attorney General or local prosecuting authority with jurisdiction to act.

When interpreting provisions of the CFCA, California courts routinely refer to federal court rulings interpreting similar provisions contained in the Federal False Claims Act, upon which the CFCA was originally patterned. This clarification is consistent with the majority of existing federal court rulings interpreting similar language contained in the Federal False Claims Act. This clarification is also consistent with existing California case law interpreting the CFCA which identifies the California Attorney General as an "official charged with the responsibility to act in the circumstances" for statute of limitations purposes. (See *State of California ex rel. Hindin v. Hewlett-Packard Co.* (2007) 153 Cal. App. 4th 307, 314.)
