PRAYER

Instead of waiting for the public to lead us, let this House speak up and lead to form a better California. Let us do it with enthusiasm and confidence as King did, remembering the words of the song *I Don't Feel No Ways Tired*, "I've come too far from where I started from. Nobody told me the road would be easy. And I don't believe he brought me this far just to leave me."

Father, I don't believe You brought California, this nation, and this world this far along the path towards justice and equality simply to leave us. So we continue the work knowing that the arc of the moral universe is long and sometimes hard and difficult, but we have Your assurance it always bends toward justice.—AMEN.
