**INTRODUCTION AND FIRST READING OF
ASSEMBLY BILLS**

The following bills were introduced and read the first time:

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 141—Saldana. An act relating to water.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 142—Plescia. An act to amend Sections 17072, 17131.4, 17131.5, 17215, 17215.1, 17215.4, and 19184 of, and to add Sections 17138.5, 17138.6, and 17216 to, the Revenue and Taxation Code, relating to taxation, to take effect immediately, tax levy.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 143—Coto. An act to add Section 47632.7 to the Education Code, relating to charter schools.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 144—Coto. An act to add and repeal Section 60860 of the Education Code, relating to pupil testing.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 145—Coto. An act to add and repeal Article 3 (commencing with Section 52970) of Chapter 13 of Part 28 of Division 4 of Title 2 of the Education Code, relating to pupil instruction, and making an appropriation therefor.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 146—Smyth (Principal coauthor: Senator Runner). An act to add Article 1.5 (commencing with Section 35715) to Chapter 4 of Part 21 of Division 3 of Title 2 of the Education Code, relating to school districts.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 147—Wolk. An act relating to persons with disabilities.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 148—Alarcon and Parra. An act to amend Sections 290.46 and 3003 of the Penal Code, relating to sex offenders.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 149—Bass. An act to amend Section 300.2 of, and to add Sections 361.32, 361.33, 361.34, and 361.35 to, the Welfare and Institutions Code, relating to dependent children.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 150—Lieu. An act relating to financial literacy.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 151—Berryhill. An act to amend Section 830.1 of the Penal Code, relating to peace officers, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.
