### INTRODUCTION AND FIRST READING OF ASSEMBLY BILLS

The following bills were introduced and read the first time:

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 226—Mathis.** An act to amend Section 99268.17 of the Public Utilities Code, relating to transportation.

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 227—Jones-Sawyer and Kamlager-Dove.** An act to amend Section 70373 of the Government Code, and to amend Sections 1202.4 and 1465.8 of the Penal Code, relating to fines and assessments.

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 228—Aguiar-Curry.** An act to add Sections 110611 and 111691 to the Health and Safety Code, relating to hemp.

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 229—Nazarian.** An act to add Section 12300.5 to the Welfare and Institutions Code, relating to in-home supportive services.

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 230—Brough.** An act to amend Section 699.5 of the Military and Veterans Code, relating to veterans.

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 231—Mathis.** An act to add Sections 21080.44 and 21080.45 to the Public Resources Code, relating to environmental quality.

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 232—Cervantes.** An act relating to community colleges.

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 233—Cooley and Daly.** An act to add Section 49 to the Insurance Code, relating to insurance.

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 234—Nazarian.** An act to add and repeal Sections 17053.50 and 23650 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, relating to taxation, to take effect immediately, tax levy.
