ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 109—Alquist. An act to amend Section 15630 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, relating to human services.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 110—Zettel. An act to amend Sections 17053.49 and 23649 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, relating to taxation, to take effect immediately, tax levy.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 111—Havice. An act to add Sections 31693 and 31694.5 to the Government Code, relating to county employees.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 112—Longville. An act to amend Section 63010 of the Government Code, relating to infrastructure finance.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 113—Pavley (Coauthors: Aroner and Hertzberg). An act to add Chapter 9.5 (commencing with Section 8760) to Division 1 of Title 2 of the Government Code, relating to the California Poet Laureate, and making an appropriation therefor.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 114—Washington. An act to add Chapter 9 (commencing with Section 17999) to Part 1.5 of Division 13 of the Health and Safety Code, relating to housing.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 115—Cardoza (Principal coauthor: Senator Burton). An act relating to the Historic State Capitol, making an appropriation therefor, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 116—Nakano. An act to amend Section 18152.5 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, relating to taxation, to take effect immediately, tax levy.
