ASSEMBLY BILLS**

The following bills were introduced and read the first time:

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 176—Salas. An act relating to water, and making an appropriation therefor.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 177—Chávez. An act to add Section 11174.2 to the Penal Code, relating to child abuse and neglect.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 178—Eggman. An act to amend Section 14501 of the Public Resources Code, relating to recycling.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 179—Cervantes. An act to amend Section 14502 of, and to add Sections 14506.7 and 14516 to, the Government Code, relating to transportation.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 180—Wood (Coauthor: Senator Hernandez). An act to amend Section 14102.5 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, relating to Medi-Cal.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 181—Lackey (Principal coauthor: Senator Cannella) (Coauthors: Chávez, Flora, Gallagher, Cristina Garcia, and Voepel) (Coauthors: Senators Anderson, Vidak, and Wilk). An act to amend Section 17053.5 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, relating to taxation, to take effect immediately, tax levy.

ASSEMBLY CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 2—Cristina Garcia. A resolution to propose to the people of the State of California an amendment to the Constitution of the State, by amending Section 34 of Article XIII thereof, relating to taxation.
