**INTRODUCTION AND FIRST READING OF
ASSEMBLY BILLS**

The following bills were introduced and read the first time:

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1663—Maienschein. An act to amend Sections 416.9, 416.17, and 416.19 of the Health and Safety Code, and to amend Sections 1800, 1800.3, 1812, 1821, 1835, 1850, 1860.5, and 1863 of, to add Sections 1835.5, 1836, 1861.5, and 2350.5 to, and to add Part 10 (commencing with 3950) to Division 4 of, the Probate Code, relating to protective proceedings.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1664—Gabriel (Coauthors: Bauer-Kahan, Berman, Bloom, Friedman, Levine, Medina, and Ward) (Coauthors: Senators Allen, Becker, Glazer, Hertzberg, Newman, Rubio, Stern, and Wiener). An act to amend Section 8588.9 of the Government Code, relating to state government.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1665—Seyarto (Coauthors: Chen, Lackey, Mathis, Patterson, Smith, and Voepel) (Coauthors: Senators Dahle, Grove, Jones, Nielsen, and Ochoa Bogh). An act to amend Sections 667.5 and 1170.125 of the Penal Code, relating to crimes.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1666—Bauer-Kahan. An act to add Section 123469 to the Health and Safety Code, relating to abortion.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1667—Cooper. An act relating to the State Teachers' Retirement System.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1668—Patterson. An act to amend Section 5845 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, relating to mental health.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1669—Cunningham (Coauthors: Chen, Choi, Davies, Flora, Fong, Lackey, Mathis, Nguyen, Seyarto, Smith, Valladares, and Voepel). An act to add Section 3105 to the Civil Code, relating to internet service providers.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1670—Bryan. An act to add Chapter 8.3 (commencing with Section 6150) to Title 7 of Part 3 of the Penal Code, relating to the Commission on Alternatives to Incarceration.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1671—Patterson. An act to add Article 22.5 (commencing with Section 70026) to Chapter 2 of Part 42 of Division 5 of Title 3 of the Education Code, relating to student financial aid.
