**INTRODUCTION AND FIRST READING OF
ASSEMBLY BILLS**

The following resolution was introduced and read the first time:

ASSEMBLY CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 4—Keene. A resolution to propose to the people of the State of California an amendment to the Constitution of the State, by amending Sections 10 and 12 of Article IV thereof, by amending Section 6 of Article XIII B thereof, by amending Section 8 of Article XVI thereof, by amending Section 6 of Article XIX thereof, by repealing Section 1 of Article XIX A thereof, and by amending Section 1 of Article XIX B thereof, relating to state finance.
