ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 130—Jeffries. An act to amend Section 530.5 of the Penal Code, relating to identity theft.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 131—Evans. An act to amend Section 68085.1 of the Government Code, and to amend Sections 317, 903.1, and 903.45 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, relating to juvenile court costs.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 132—Mendoza (Principal coauthor: Huffman). An act to amend Section 32282 of the Education Code, relating to school safety.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 133—Smyth. An act to amend Section 66484 of the Government Code, relating to subdivisions.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 134—Blakeslee. An act to amend Sections 1803 and 12810 of, and to add Section 38304.1 to, the Vehicle Code, relating to vehicles.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 135—Jeffries. An act to add Article 4.6 (commencing with Section 4149) to Chapter 1 of Part 2 of Division 4 of the Public Resources Code, relating to fire protection.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 136—Silva. An act to amend Section 19596.1 of the Business and Professions Code, relating to horse racing, and making an appropriation therefor.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 137—Jeffries. An act to amend Section 54952 of the Government Code, relating to open meetings.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 138—Hayashi. An act to amend, repeal, and add Section 5076 of, and to add Section 5076.1 to, the Business and Professions Code, relating to accountants.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 139—Brownley. An act to amend Sections 2 and 16 of the Los Angeles County Flood Control Act (Chapter 755 of the Statutes of 1915), relating to the Los Angeles County Flood Control District.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 140—Beall. An act to add Article 2.5 (commencing with Section 4659.5) to Chapter 5 of Division 4.5 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, relating to services for persons with developmental disabilities.
