# INTRODUCTION AND FIRST READING OF ASSEMBLY BILLS

The following bills were introduced and read the first time:

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 159—Calderon.** An act to add Article 4.5 (commencing with Section 111548) to Chapter 6 of Part 5 of Division 104 of the Health and Safety Code, relating to drugs and devices.

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 160—Dababneh.** An act to amend Sections 186.2 and 186.8 of the Penal Code, relating to criminal profiteering.

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 161—Chau.** An act to add Chapter 2.7 (commencing with Section 18898) to Division 8 of the Business and Professions Code, relating to athletic trainers.

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 162—Rodriguez.** An act to add and repeal Section 21651.1 of the Vehicle Code, relating to state highways.

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 163—Williams.** An act to amend Section 44262.5 of the Education Code, and to amend Section 1 of Chapter 324 of the Statutes of 2009, relating to teacher credentialing.

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 164—Gomez.** An act relating to the payment of claims against the state, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 165—Gomez.** An act relating to state claims, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.
