ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 277—Alanis. An act to add Part 1.5 (commencing with Section 4439) to Division 4.1 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, relating to autism.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 278—Ransom. An act to amend Section 127501.11 of the Health and Safety Code, relating to health care.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 279—Patel. An act to add Section 60605.14 to the Education Code, relating to school libraries.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 280—Aguiar-Curry. An act to amend Section 1367.27 of the Health and Safety Code, and to amend Section 10133.15 of the Insurance Code, relating to health care coverage.
