**INTRODUCTION AND FIRST READING OF ASSEMBLY BILLS**

The following bills were introduced and read the first time:

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 11—Rod Pacheco.** An act to repeal Article 10 (commencing with Section 890) of Chapter 4 of Part 1 of Division 1 of the Public Utilities Code, and Part 19 (commencing with Section 40001) of Division 2 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, relating to taxation, to take effect immediately, tax levy.

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 12—Rod Pacheco.** An act relating to add Section 743.2 to the Public Utilities Code, relating to public utilities.
