ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 159—Chávez. An act to add Section 66025.4 to the Education Code, relating to public postsecondary education.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 160—Alejo. An act to amend Section 7522.04 of the Government Code, relating to public employees' retirement.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 161—Campos. An act to add Section 6325.5 to the Family Code, relating to restraining orders.

ASSEMBLY CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 3—Campos. A resolution to propose to the people of the State of California an amendment to the Constitution of the State, by amending Sections 1 and 4 of Article XIII A thereof, by amending Section 2 of Article XIII C thereof, by amending Section 3 of Article XIII D thereof, and by amending Section 18 of Article XVI thereof, relating to local government finance.
