ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 162—Holden. An act to amend Section 65584 of the Government Code, relating to land use.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 163—Atkins. An act to amend Section 6363.4 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, relating to taxation, to take effect immediately, tax levy.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 164—Wieckowski. An act to amend Section 5956.6 of the Government Code, relating to infrastructure financing.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 165—Beth Gaines. An act to amend, renumber, and add Section 8491 of, and to repeal Section 8490 of, the Fish and Game Code, relating to commercial fishing.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 166—Roger Hernández. An act to add Section 51220.7 to the Education Code, relating to pupil instruction.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 167—Hagman. An act to amend Section 17204 of the Business and Professions Code, relating to unfair competition.

ASSEMBLY CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 4—Olsen (Principal coauthors: Senators Huff and Wolk). A resolution to propose to the people of the State of California an amendment to the Constitution of the State, by amending Section 8 of Article IV thereof, relating to the Legislature.
