#### **INTRODUCTION AND FIRST READING OF ASSEMBLY BILLS**

The following bills were introduced and read the first time:

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1907—Pellerin (Coauthor: Jackson).** An act to amend Section 10601.2 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, relating to child welfare.

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1908—Schiavo.** An act to add Section 78.6 to the Military and Veterans Code, relating to veterans.

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1909—Quirk-Silva.** An act to amend Section 1214 of the Penal Code, relating to criminal fines.

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1910—Lackey.** An act to amend Section 9801 of the Unemployment Insurance Code, relating to employment services programs.

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1911—Reyes.** An act to amend Section 1569.35 of the Health and Safety Code, relating to care facilities.

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1912—Pacheco.** An act to add Section 3261 to the Public Utilities Code, relating to electricity.

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1913—Addis.** An act to amend Section 44691 of the Education Code, relating to pupil safety.

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1914—Grayson.** An act to add Article 3.6 (commencing with Section 78264) to Chapter 2 of Part 48 of Division 7 of Title 3 of the Education Code, relating to community colleges.

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1915—Arambula.** An act to amend Section 49414.3 of, and to add Article 5.5 (commencing with Section 49478) to Chapter 9 of Part 27 of Division 4 of Title 2 of, the Education Code, relating to pupil health.

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1916—Maienschein.** An act to add Sections 21712.3, 21712.4, 21712.6, 21712.7, 21712.8, 21712.9, and 21715.5 to the Business and Professions Code, and to amend Section 1980.5 of the Civil Code, relating to business.

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1917—Muratsuchi.** An act to add Article 6.5 (commencing with Section 35220) to Chapter 2 of Part 21 of Division 3 of Title 2 of the Education Code, relating to local educational agencies.

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1918—Wood.** An act to add Section 18940.3 to the Health and Safety Code, relating to building standards.

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1919—Weber.** An act relating to pupil rights.
