**INTRODUCTION AND FIRST READING OF
ASSEMBLY BILLS**

The following bills were introduced and read the first time:

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 16—Oropeza and Diaz. An act to add Section 363.5 to the Public Utilities Code, relating to public utilities.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 17—Leonard. An act to add Section 743.5 to the Public Utilities Code, relating to public utilities, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 18—Hertzberg. An act to amend Section 11005.1 of the Government Code, to add Sections 368.2, 368.3, and 368.4 to the Public Utilities Code, and to add and repeal Division 27 (commencing with Section 80000) to the Water Code, relating to public utilities, making an appropriation therefor, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 19—Briggs. An act to add and repeal Section 6357.1 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, relating to taxation, to take effect immediately, tax levy.
